

Undergraduate Exchange & Study Abroad

IUM Students Wishing to Study Abroad

Undergraduate students are encouraged to take advantage of the many partnerships the International University of Monaco has with quality institutions abroad. Academic staff is available for advice and should be consulted to help choose an institution and complete the application process.

To be eligible for the Study Abroad Program, IUM students must:

- have a minimum CGPA of 3.0.
- have earned a minimum of 44 credits at the time they start their term abroad
- have a minimum TOEFL score of 550 paper based / 213 computer based/ 80 iBT
- earn their last 16 credits at IUM

Additionally:

- Students must receive written approval of their completed application from the Director of Undergraduate Programs.
- Any student who goes on a term abroad without written approval will be refused credit transfer, will be dropped from the University, and will need to re-apply for admission to IUM and re-pay the application fee.
- Students must follow a minimum course load of 4 courses (12 term credits hours) per term at the host institution.
- Only grades of C or better, as evidenced by the official host institution transcript, earn transfer credit. Only credit is transferred; no letter grades will appear on the IUM transcript.
- Students may study abroad for a maximum period of one full academic year.

Deadlines for application vary from institution to institution, but as a rule, **application must be completed before:**

- **October 20**, to study abroad in the Winter term
- **April 1**, to study abroad in the Fall term

Students from other universities wishing to study at IUM

Undergraduate students from other universities are welcome to study at IUM for one or two consecutive terms or a full academic year (comprising three terms) and earn credit toward their home institution degree.

To apply to the IUM Exchange Program, students must have a minimum:

- CGPA of 3.0 or its equivalent at their home institution
- Course load of 4 courses (12 credits) during each term at IUM
- English Proficiency Requirements:
 - TOEFL score of 570 paper based / 230 computer based/ 88 iBT
 - TOEIC score 850
 - Cambridge CAE: score A, B, or C
 - Cambridge Certificate of Proficiency: score A, B, or C
 - Cambridge IELTS: 7.0, Academic option preferred
 - Certification from home university of 2 years full time study in English

They will also need to provide:

- 4 pictures
- An official transcript from their home university
- An essay explaining why they want to come to IUM on exchange
- English Proficiency test scores no older than two years
- A letter of reference from a professor or from an employer
- Non-refundable Exchange Application fee of 200 Euros

Note: The Exchange application fee is waived for students coming from institutions that have signed a partnership agreement with IUM, please refer to the list in the previous section.

At the end of the exchange period, IUM will send an official transcript to the students' home institution, which is solely responsible for deciding if and how transfer credit will be accepted.

Exchange students have the same rights and duties as other IUM students. They are expected to read the Student Handbook & Catalog and to participate in the Orientation organised by IUM.

Deadlines for application to the IUM as an Exchange Student are the following:

- For the Fall term 2007: **April 20, 2007**
- For the Winter term 2008 : **October 20, 2007**
- For the Spring term 2008: **February 20, 2008**
- For the Fall term 2008: **April 20, 2008**
